10.4 Director Infrastructure & Planning Report – Prepared by James Magee**NBN Planning for Warracknabeal**

Design of the system, which will deliver NBN to the majority of the township of Warracknabeal has commenced. The construction should commence later in 2017. The area of coverage is also under consideration.

Minyip Roundabout

VicRoads have commenced works at the Minyip Roundabout. Works include replacement of crumbling outer kerbing and reconstruction of the central roundabout itself. The hotmix surface will be replaced as well. The central portion of the roundabout will have a semi mountable apron which will allow larger vehicles to turn easier.

Automatic Weather Station (AWS) for Warracknabeal

The newly installed weather station located at the Warracknabeal Aerodrome is operational and live data can be found on the Bureau of Meteorology with observations taken at least every 30 minutes.

Risk & Safety Report to Council – Prepared by Barry Sullivan

A final skin cancer lecture followed by skin checks were completed on staff for 2016. Overall feedback was very positive with staff requesting the checks annually. Three staff members from Buloke Shire Council joined in to trial the program before they take it on next year. Consideration is being given to make it an annual event and possibly extending the program to include medical checks using the same process. Currently other organisations within the region have both each year.

OH&S Management Plan was developed in corporation with the Community & Economic Development Officer to ensure all safety systems were in place and operating prior to the start of the Sheep Hills Silo Art Project. A further OH&S Management Plan has been developed and is in place for the up and coming Rupanyup Silo Art Project.

A Health & Safety Risk Assessment was conducted on Murtoa's Stick Shed relating to the health and safety of visitors attending the centre with the assessment covering the car park facilities, office entrance facilities and inside the stick shed. Risks and hazards were highlighted at each location and actions were noted to address each risk & hazard. The committee will determine persons responsible to manage each risk within their group. The assessment will be used as a future planning tool to have the Stick Shed up and running as a key tourist destination in Murtoa.

Safety audits are currently being conducted on all of the swimming pools within the Shire. The 2016 -17 Audit has focused around chemical storage and handling, pool structures and surrounds, plant equipment and circulation systems, water and pool amenities, as well as fire and emergency responses. Overall, the pools audited so far have shown that they are well maintained and in good condition. which is a reflection of the dedication and commitment of the individual pool's committees and volunteers that help to keep their pool open for their community and visitors to the area.

A report will be tabled to all swimming pool committees highlighting small improvements to be made to improve health and safety standards. Discussions are being held to improve networking between individual pools so that ideas such as pool maintenance, safety and pool promotion can be shared. A proposed get-together for a day is being considered, which would involve visiting individual pools to look at how the committees and volunteers manage their pool.

I am currently upgrading the Yarriambiack Shire Council's Office Emergency Management Plan for 2017. Changes include reducing the number of Office Wardens from seven to two, with Wardens having the authority to nominate a staff member/s to assist them in the event of an emergency. Investigating and reporting on numerous incidents in January. Six incidents have been reported, investigated and recorded so far this month.

10.6 Community Services Report – Prepared by Gavin Blinman**Kindergartens**

We are currently in the process of staff replacement at Warracknabeal Kindergarten with our teacher leaving at the end of last year. Advertisements closes on 10 January and we will make a decision once we look at applicants.

We have already replaced our teacher at Rupanyup / Minyip and Anna Kelly will start as our new teacher shortly. We held an interview for this with the Minyip Kindergarten president involved as we try to have community representation on interviews for kindergartens.

We have also replaced an assistant at Hopetoun with a current casual from our staff pool. Kindergarten staff commence back on the 30 January.

We have also discontinued the license for Woomelang Kindergarten, as we will have no enrolments moving forward with no new preschool children at Woomelang.

We will continue to monitor this but in small towns suspension of license due to low numbers occurs periodically and in this case as we did at Tempy a while ago it is unlikely this service will ever operate again.

Environmental Health/ Local Laws – Prepared by Tim Rose, Greg Wilson

Food premises inspections have been conducted leading into the Christmas holidays and no major breaches were identified. Council did not receive any food related complaints or notification of food poisoning cases over the holidays as had happened in previous years. One new food business in Warracknabeal has changed ownership and due to re-open in coming days.

Registration renewals were sent to all food, health and accommodation establishments in late November. All annual registrations under respective legislation expired on the 31 December. Many businesses have renewed for the 2017 year and Council will soon send reminder notices to proprietors who are yet to complete their businesses registration renewal.

Mosquito numbers have subsided in recent times due to many breeding sites evaporating. However, the ecology of mosquitoes and flood waters has presented communities with an increased risk of transmission of mosquito borne conditions and diseases as seen following the 2010/11 floods. Ross River Virus cases in the region have increased over the past 4 weeks. The Department of Health & Human Services have recognised this issue and have provided Council with the opportunity to be reimbursed for all mosquito control program expenditure. This funding will assist Council in controlling potential breeding sites and monitoring existing mosquito populations to determine species and if diseases are currently present.

Council is in the process of ordering control agents and equipment. Council has heavily promoted both the funding announcement and how residents can protect themselves by contributing to newspaper articles, radio interviews and distribution of educational materials. Council conducted BGA monitoring across the municipality over this period. All recreational weir pools and lakes have been inspected and samples obtained to determine overall safety of these waters. Currently awaiting sample results.

Onsite wastewater regulation remains active. A number of applications have been received over the reporting period and Council is processing these requests accordingly. No complaints in this area have been received.

Council conducted interviews for the Local Laws Officer and has offered the position to a suitable applicant. It is anticipated that the position will be filled by mid February. In the interim, Council's ability to respond to matters in this area remains limited.

A number of non-serious complaints have been received and investigations, where possible, have been conducted.

Aged and Disability – Prepared by Lisa Dunkley Home & Community Care (HACC)

All staff in HACC have had Yang Ngalung Maligundij Cultural training by Traditional Owner Joanne Clarke from the Wimmera.

The Training package focuses on gaining an understanding about the five traditional clan groups of the Wimmera Region – Wotjobaluk, Wergaia Jaadwa, Jadawadjali, and Jupagulk people.

The aim was to have strategies that are culturally appropriate when staff are working with Traditional Owners and transient community members. All staff attended and were amazed by the stories told by Traditional Owner Joanne Clarke. We hope to have her back in the near future.

In December we arranged for Memory Strategies Groups in Hopetoun and Minyip to combine one session here in Warracknabeal.

Buses were organised, to bring them together to listen to Dementia spokesperson, Kay Miller from Ballarat.

In the next month all staff will be updated in medication and First aid.

Through out the year we will be focusing training in Dementia with staff so they are aware of what to look for and ways to handle certain situations when they arise .

Council advertised contract C212/2016 being the Supply and Delivery of One (1) Grader for the Southern Works Area on the 16 November, 2016 through Tenderlink.

Tenders for the above mentioned contract closed at 2.00 pm on Monday the 12 December, 2017.

Submissions for the tender will be evaluated by Council at the January 2017 meeting.

2. Beulah Memorial Swimming Pool

In association with the Beulah Swimming Pool Committee, Council has prepared an application for funding under the Community Infrastructure Fund in relation to heating the Beulah Swimming Pool and extend the period that it can be used from around three months to possibly 6 months.

The cost of the project is \$49,000 which I have allocated an amount of \$5,000 in Council's 2016-2017 budget as a contribution towards the project.

I am pleased to advise Council that this application for \$32,800 in funding has been successful with the project works commencing in July 2017.

3. Contract C214/2017 - Minor patching including stabilisation and sealing of existing road pavement material

Council has advertised contract C214/2017 being Minor patching including stabilisation and sealing of existing road pavement material –

General Stabilisation Works (1943 m²), Flood Stabilisation Works (2441 m²)

Tenders close on Friday 27 January, 2017 for the abovementioned contract.

4. Grain Bags

Currently working with the Grampians Central West Waste and Resource Recovery Group regarding the possibility of recycling grain bags.

Due to the size of this years harvest and the amount of grain that is being stored on farm in these grains bags, there will be a need to deal with the bags when grain is emptied.

The Group are investigating a process in which Council can accept the bags, store them and then have them collected for recycling.
