Draft Local Law - Summary

Victorian Councils have the broad power under the Local Government Act 2020 to make local laws 'for or with respect to any act, matter or thing in respect of which the council has a function or power under this or any other Act'. Yarriambiack Shire Council has developed the current Draft Local Law to respond to issues and community needs within our local context.



UNSIGHLTY AND
DANGEROUS PROPERTIES

Property owners have an obligation to ensure that their property is not unsightly, dangerous or a fire hazard.

STORAGE OF UNREGISTERED VEHICLES

Property owners are permitted to only store one unregistered vehicle in public view, without a permit.

FIREWORKS

To ensure adequate notice to residents and to maintain amenity, a permit will be required to discharge fireworks.

BURNING OF MATERIALS

Community members will not be able to burn materials that are offensive. This includes plastics, rubber and various other materials.

CAMPING OR OCCUPATION
OF PRIVATE LAND

A person is not allowed to camp or live in a caravan on private property for longer than 60 days, within a township area, unless a permit has been issued authorising the activity.

KEEPING OF ANIMALS

Council has continued to limit the number of animals a person can keep on their township and residential property, without a permit. In a township, residents are limited to 2 dogs and 3 cats. Various other animals are listed in the local law.

BEE HIVES

Permits are required for any person who would like to keep a bee hive within a township.

FEEDING OF STRAY
ANIMALS AND BIRDS ON
PRIVATE PROPERTY

Residents will not be able to feed stray animals within a township. This law will prevent a number of amenity and nuisance matters from arising in our townships.

ANIMAL ACCOMMODATION

Animals must be stored in a way that does not cause a nuisance to neighbours. Animals are also required to be adequately contained to the property.

HEAVY & LONG VEHICLE
PARKING

Heavy and long vehicles will not be permitted to park in a township for longer than 1 hour, without a permit.

FIREWOOD COLLECTION

Firewood collection from a Council controlled road will not be permitted without a permit.

ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION IN A TOWNSHIP

The local law will continue to prohibit alcohol consumption in any public place within a township, between the hours of 11pm and 6am.

PUBLIC EVENTS

Public events may only occur where they have been registered with Council's events team.
