TSV have confirmed they will visit the weir pools at Warracknabeal, Brim and Beulah. They will assess boating activity and current safety rules and liaise with local interested communities and Council.

**Flood Recovery Works**

Repair works from the 2011 flooding event was completed in January 2013. A final claim has been submitted.

Total cost of the works was \$6,445,012.00

**National Broadband Network Tower for Rupanyup**

The National Broadband Network wireless tower has been given planning approval by Yarriambiack Shire Council.

All towns listed for wireless in our municipality have now received their planning approvals.

**GrainCorp Woomelang**

## **10.6 Community Services – Prepared by Gavin Blinman**

### **Kindergartens**

Kindergarten staff had their second pupil free day this term and attended a ZART Art Workshop in Melbourne; they also attended up-dates on Emergency Planning in pre-schools.

Barry Sullivan is completing OH&S checklists across the Kindergarten Centre's and any items of concern are being reported and investigated by maintenance staff or committees.

The Hopetoun Kindergarten has been scheduled for a National Quality Framework Audit on 3 & 4 September 2013.

The new Early Years Staff Agreement has been reviewed and the Municipal Association of Victoria is meeting with unions to negotiate on our behalf, it may take to November before we receive a response.

### **Aged and Disability**

#### **HACCPAC Mobile**

On Tuesday, 27 August 2013 we trained another six Community Care Workers (they are going well); Michelle has had a few issues but is now out on the road working along side staff to ensure a smoother transition. The Community Care Workers can see the positives in the change and are becoming more confident with them every week; hoping to put on the last six in the next two weeks.

### **Staff Meetings**

A meeting for Community Care Workers is scheduled for Thursday, 26 September 2013.

### **Volunteer Transport**

This month the numbers have increased (doubled compared to last month).

### **Portsea Camp**

Portsea Camp dates have been finalised – 11 to 17 January 2014. The cost per child to attend the camp will be \$312, however the Yarriambiack Shire Council will subsidise \$100 to reduce cost to \$212 per child. We will advertise throughout the schools across the Shire in the next week.

### **Senior's Week**

Senior's Week is scheduled for Wednesday, 16 October 2013 at the Warracknabeal Town Hall with entertainment by Sentimental Journey. A free BBQ luncheon will be held afterwards at the Warracknabeal Leisure Centre.

We have received a large amount of interest all ready from across our Shire and neighbouring Shires. Transport will be provided for this event. Posters have been sent out and advertising in local papers will commence mid September.

**Environmental Health / Local Laws**

Food premises inspections have continued during August with the majority of food business proprietors maintaining their premises to a satisfactory standard. Businesses that do not comply with relevant standards have additional inspections scheduled to ensure compliance.

Businesses and community groups appear comfortable with the Streatrader database, as Council is receiving approximately 10 applications per month for temporary food businesses.

Two onsite wastewater applications have been received this month and the assessment of applications and the proposed sites has been completed. An additional CFA Fire Station to be constructed in Kewell has also been received by Council.

One onsite wastewater complaint has been received for a home in the south of the Shire. This matter has been ongoing and discussions are currently underway with the owner in order to get the matter rectified.

Council's Public Health & Wellbeing Plan 2013-2017 is continuing to progress. Draft goals have been completed and soon each relevant Council department will be required to develop their strategies and objectives based on the plan's goals that they would like to achieve in the identified key public health and wellbeing areas.

Council hosted a recent Environmental Health Officer Regional Meeting on 16 August 2013. Environmental Health Officer's (EHO's) for a total of seven Councils and a member from Department of Health were in attendance. Guest speakers who presented on the day were Lawyer, Louisa Dicker, who gave a detailed presentation on nuisances as defined in the *Public Health & Wellbeing Act 2008* and three officers from the Clandestine Drug Squad, who provided an insight into the emerging scene of illegal drug laboratories being established more frequently in rural and regional areas. Both presentations were very informative and of value to the EHO's present.

Wandering dogs has been minimal with only two impounded and released to the owners. Another was found and is still with us, this dog was mostly likely dumped due to its age, he's now in need of a home.

Two pups were surrendered and we are trying to find homes for these at present.

Cats are still an issue with continued trapping in the worst areas, so no change there.

Greg Wilson (Ranger) and back up attended an incident in Murtoa earlier this month, where a truck hit and killed several cattle on the Wimmera Highway at Murtoa.

Another callout after hours was to a dog hit by a car on the highway north of Warracknabeal.

The demolition of Danny's old second hand store is now complete and work has now started on the demolition of the old funeral home in Murtoa. This is expected to be completed late next week. This action has been done under enforcement by Council (a joint effort by the Local Law and Building Departments).

Greg Wilson (Ranger) attended a session in Bendigo run by the Municipal Association of Victoria on recognising violence against women and or children in the home.

It is something that has been recognised as a result of the work they do in enforcement situations, can create situations of violence at a client's home after they leave or even while there on the job. There is a lot of work being done in this field through the White Ribbon Association.

After the Council Meeting held on 14 August 2013, the old Local Law No 5 was re-enacted until the new Local Law is completed; a letter was sent to the Hon Jeanette Powell MLC, Minister for Local Government informing them of the motion made. We have had a response back to say they received the letter and are looking at our process.

The new Local Law is progressing, we should have the next draft by mid September.

We are working on Council's Animal Welfare Plan, this sits within the Emergency Management Plan; Rhonda McNeil (Emergency Management Fire Coordinator) is doing the early stages of work.

### **Youth**

The 'Yarriambiack Has Talent' show was a great success with 406 tickets being given out on the night. The work done by students and staff from the Warracknabeal Secondary College was fantastic and made the night enjoyable without any issues.

Justice Crew provided the students with a great workshop during the day and their performance and friendliness to the crowd was really positive.

I have looked at our Youth Worker situation and have an agreement from the Health Alliance to engage a Project Worker to review our Youth Plan and the role of youth work in our Shire. This will be conducted over the next month.

### **Emergency Relief**

All Cart members have been advised and invited to an Emergency Relief Exercise being planned for November.

Emergency relief clients were low last month, as we have now distributed money to Rural Northwest Health and Dunmunkle Health to assist social workers to give Emergency Relief funds immediately, rather than waiting for a referral through the Yarriambiack Shire Council.

### **Volunteer Transport**

11 people were transported 2,326 kilometers this month; Horsham being the main destination.

### **Maternal and Child Health**

The White Ribbon round at the Speed Field Days Mallee Football Finals was a great success with many positive comments after the game about the anti violence message.

The end of financial year stats for our Maternal & Child Health service is as follows:-

- 64 Births, with 22 of these first time mothers
- A new mothers group has been established in Warracknabeal
- 97 enrolments for service, with 82 three year olds having the screening checks required, 73 of these had sight checks (one of the highest check rates in our region)

**10.7 Infrastructure Services Report – Prepared by Bernie Naylor****Contract C178/2013 – Alterations and Additions to Hopetoun Kindergarten**

Council advertised the abovementioned contract on Wednesday, 17 July 2013 with tenders closing on Friday, 9 August 2013.

Council received five tender submissions.

The evaluation of this Contract will be in Council's Closed Session.

**Restructure of Regional Waste Management Groups**

Yarriambiack Shire Council is a member of the Grampians Regional Waste Management Group, consisting of four Councils being Horsham Rural City, Ararat Rural City, Northern Grampians and ourselves.

This group has operated very successfully for many years and has been very active in obtaining funding to close unlicensed landfills, replace them with transfer stations and many other improvements to the way in which Council's manage waste.

The Victorian Government have announced that our Waste Management Group will now be amalgamated with the Desert Fringe and Highlands Waste Management Groups to form the Grampians Central Waste Management Group. This Group will consist of the following 12 Councils:- Yarriambiack, Hindmarsh, West Wimmera, Horsham Rural City, Northern Grampians, Ararat, Pyrenees, Central Goldfields, Hepburn, Moorabool, Golden Plains and Ballarat.

The new Regional Waste Management Groups will take effect as from Tuesday, 1 July 2014.

**Asbestos Awareness Training**

Due to a number of issues Council has incurred identifying and disposing of asbestos, Council has engaged a Consultant to undertake Asbestos Awareness Training.

This training was conducted on Monday, 2 September 2013.

The training addressed the following topics:-

- Description of what asbestos is and looks like
- Identifying asbestos containing materials
- Asbestos in the home, workplace and soil
- EPA Legislative requirements
- Exposure and health effects
- Audits, testing and monitoring
- Fire damaged asbestos
- Asbestos removal requirements
- Asbestos management plans



## Swimming Pools

**Electrical Switch Boards** – Following an electrical safety audit at the swimming pools, Council has now upgraded and replaced the electrical switchboards at Minyip, Woomelang and Hopetoun Swimming Pools.

**Warracknabeal Swimming Pool** – Council has undertaken extensive testing to ascertain where the swimming pool has been leaking from.

The results from these investigations provided the following results:-

- Major leak at the expansion joint on the centre of the filtered water return line at the start of the incline is delaminating.
- Main filtered water line pipe from main pool shell to pump in plant room heavily corroded and showing some signs of leaking.

The rectification works will be completed by the end of September.

## Transfer Stations: Re-use Shops

I have applied for funding through the Grampians Regional Waste Management Group to develop and construct Re-use Shops at the Warracknabeal, Hopetoun and Murtoa Transfer Stations.

Due to the throughput at these three sites we have the ability to reclaim and sell items that do not need to go to landfill.

The funding will enable Council to construct buildings at these sites to store these items.

**Contract C179/2013 Provision of Gravel Crushing Services**

Each year Council rips and stockpiles approximately 120,000 tonnes of gravel for our Capital Works Program.

Council has been crushing this gravel now for a few years to assist in producing a better product when undertaking gravel re-sheets and rehabilitation works.

Council advertised the abovementioned Contract on Friday, 2 August 2013 with tenders closing on Friday, 23 August 2013.

Council has received nine tenders for this Contract.

The evaluation of this Contract will be in Council's Closed Session.

These rules are designed to minimise disturbance and inconvenience to all our visitors and ensure your stay is an enjoyable one. The Park Manager & Council are committed to the safety of all our guests and will endeavour to make your stay with us an enjoyable experience.

## Park Rules

1. Failure to abide by the rules can result in refusal into the park or removal of any persons, tent or caravan.
2. Visitors are required to book in on arrival with the Park Manager. Please contact the Park Manager on the contact number provided if necessary. This will ensure all applicable fees are paid and you have access to relevant facilities within the park during your stay.
3. A park speed limit of 10 km/hr must be observed at all times. Adherence to these limits will ensure safety for all patrons.
