Local Government Infrastructure Program (LGIP)

Council have been successful in gaining \$457,000 via LGIP. The nominated projects are listed below:-

The projects are required to be completed by end of September 2015. The individual projects have been announced by the State Government during recent weeks.

Identification of Supply Chains

The Wimmera Southern Mallee Regional Transport Group with assistance of the Department of Transport, Planning and Local Infrastructure as well as Vic Roads are conducting research on:-

- key supply chains in our area
- bottlenecks and inefficiencies
- opportunities and potential priorities
- key freight generators

The project will enable government and industry to understand the transport network and industry needs and enable funding to be prioritised.

Flood Study to examine removal of the “Regulator” from Yarriambiack Creek

With the assistance of the Wimmera Catchment Management Authority (WCMA), Council have made an application to the Natural Disaster Resilience Grants Scheme for funding to conduct flood modelling of the impacts of removal of the regulator, which is in Yarriambiack Creek and within short distance of the Wimmera River.

A previous study conducted by the WCMA found 'for the larger flood events, the local flood levels were such that the higher invert level and the removal of the regulator had no significant impact on flood behaviour.' The new study will do more detailed analysis on flooding impacts and whether they exist or not.

Community consultation will be undertaken once the results of the study are in.

It is thought that the removal of the regulator will provide greater natural flows along Yarriambiack Creek during small and medium flows which would be of great benefit to our community.

Community Projects – Prepared by David Thompson**Beulah Hall Kitchen Upgrade and Beulah Multi-purpose Centre Upgrade Joint Project**

- Adequate local funding for the hall kitchen has been donated
- RDV funding of \$37,000 for this \$50,850 project was announced on 17 July 2014
- Implementation of the works is underway

Beulah BIC Commercial Kitchen Project

- Beulah BIC is planning to develop a commercial kitchen for use by the community
- Council is assisting with a grant application

Hopetoun RSL Community Hub Upgrade

- This \$57,000 project has a high level of local support with Hopetoun Lionesses, Red Cross and Happy Helpers keen to use the upgraded building
- The works involve upgrading the building to current standard, replacing doors, installing new air conditioning and floor coverings
- A wide range of local donations have been received
- RDV funding of \$30,000 for this project was announced on 2 July 2014
- LGIP funding of \$10,000 was allocated to the project in November 2014
- Electrical works have been completed
- Carpentry is 80% completed

Hopetoun Industrial Estate

- The approved estimated cost of this four Lot subdivision is \$194,000
- RDV funding of \$82,500 was approved in September 2013
- The remainder of funding is from Council
- The planning permit was issued in April 2014
- Purchase of the land by Council is complete
- Design of road works and highway works have been completed
- Electrical power works have been completed
- Water and sewerage have been completed
- Road works have commenced

Hopetoun Mallee Bush Retreat Stage 5

- Stage 5 is the construction of another accommodation unit
- RDV funding of \$60,000 was announced during October 2013
- A cultural heritage assessment has given approval for the project
- A planning permit for the development has been issued
- Building permits have been issued for the work
- A builder has been appointed
- Construction is underway

Warracknabeal Town Hall Business and Sustainability Plan

- RDV approved \$7,500 in funding for the \$10,000 project on 19 March 2014
- The final draft of the business plan has been adopted by the steering committee
- This plan is being presented to the hall committee for adoption on 1 December 2014
- The committee is keen to proceed with implementation of the business plan
- LGIP funding of \$50,000 has been allocated for works at the hall which will result from the business plan

Warracknabeal Historical Society Business and Marketing Plan

- RDV approved \$7,500 in funding for the \$10,000 project on 19 March 2014
- The business plan has been adopted by the Historical Society
- The society is proceeding with implementation of the plan
- This includes construction of the foyer which is 30% complete

Woomelang Recreation Reserve Upgrade Project

- Council in conjunction with the local committee have submitted a funding application to the Local Facilities for Local Clubs grant program
- The works include upgrading the lighting of the football ground and a shelter for the bar area
- The estimated project cost is \$32,000 plus GST

Kindergartens

All Early years' staff attended the workplace bullying and discrimination workshops (received positive feedback from staff on the training and awareness content).

Congratulations to Viv Yetman our playgroup facilitator at Tempy / Patchewollock; she was recently a guest of Department of Education & Early Childhood Development at the Crown Function Centre for the Education Department Awards. Viv was nominated as supported playgroup facilitator of the year, a big achievement that recognises her work with remote communities and the Shires support over a number of years.

Kindergarten AGM's are underway with new committees formed for next year, the reference group looking at the orientation handbook for committees has completed a third draft.

Environmental Health / Local Laws – Prepared by Tim Rose and Greg Wilson

Food business inspections have continued during the month, with the majority of all for-profit premises being inspected for 2014. Council is now in the process of speaking to all sporting clubs about any compliance issues and providing information to assist them in their statutory obligations.

All registered premises renewals have been completed for the 2015 period and it is anticipated that proprietors will receive these documents in the near future.

Food sampling occurred over this period. A number of samples were obtained from a variety of premises. Sample results were satisfactory, with the exception of one premise. The proprietor has been spoken to about ways to prevent poor results in the future and Council will continue to monitor.

Onsite wastewater assessments have been varied this period. A total of four permits have been issued, with two consisting of conventional septic systems, while the remaining two involved the installation of aerated wastewater treatment systems. A number of progress and final inspections has also been completed.

Council's Blue Green Algae monitoring program commenced early this month and based on the sampling of all lakes and weir pools in Yarriambiack Shire, no toxic blue green algae was detected. Council will continue to monitor these areas for potential risks in accordance with our monitoring policy.

The month of October has been busy with fire prevention inspections. The northern part of the Shire was exceptionally good this year, with many people having their blocks cleaned up early. However central and southern parts of the Shire were not so good, with many properties needing a notice served on them. There were a total of 222 notices issued with non compliance of around 30 percent at this stage as not all re-inspections have been completed. We are on track to have all of these works completed by the end of November.

The pound has been very quiet with only a couple of dogs being trapped around the Warracknabeal area.

We have had issues with dogs attacking livestock in the Dumbuoy area.

No dogs were caught for the first two attacks, however a dog was recently caught killing lambs and the owner and the dog are being dealt with. Council are still remaining vigilant in this area, to catch other offending dogs.

Roosters have become another issue in several towns across the Shire, these are all being followed up with and owners being given notices to remove them from there properties.

It seems like cats have all gone into hiding with only three trapped for the month.

There has been an issue with horses in Rupanyup, this problem is still being worked on (expecting a good outcome); horses are waiting for a new home outside of the township area.

Aged and Disability – Prepared by Lisa Dunkley

November was a busy month with many training sessions being held for staff and public. One of the training days for the seniors was Safety on Gophers and Scooters which was held at the senior citizens clubrooms and was well attended. We will try to hold this training session annually.

Our Home & Community Care (HACC) staff had a busy year with many training courses to attend, to up-skill so they can give the client the best service to able them to stay at home. Other training included Professional Boundaries Training and Workplace Bullying Training.

Youth

Hopetoun P12 College has initiated planning for a youth film festival for Youth Week 2015. This will be a film competition followed by a public screening of young people's films.

A student committee has outlined the plans for three days of sporting and cultural activities culminating in the film festival at Lake Lascelles. The youth worker will oversee the project which will be planned and run by Hopetoun youth, partnering with Rural Northwest Health, Gateway BEET and Hopetoun Neighbourhood House. A National Youth Week Grant has been submitted to assist with funding the event.

A group of Hopetoun P12 students recently won an award at the CPA 'Plan Your Own Enterprise' competition for their business plan for an outdoor cinema in Hopetoun. The young people have decided to take this one step further and organise an outdoor cinema night scheduled for Friday, 5 December 2014 at Lake Lascelles; with support from the youth worker. It is aimed at giving young people and the community some entertainment as well as allowing youth to be responsible for planning and organising an event for their peers.

A Youth Summit is being planned for February 2015 in Warracknabeal. This will be an opportunity for youth from all areas of the Shire to come together and discuss new ideas for youth-led events and to launch the idea of the Youth Action Council.

Michelle Hallam has organised a thankyou luncheon for all our Volunteers who have donated their time for others, without their help it could not be possible. Maternal and Child Health – Prepared by Nanette Freckleton and Ros Barber

Lisa Gillard from Playgroup Victoria visited the Woomelang and Hopetoun Playgroups on Monday, 10 November 2014. This was a great morning for the mothers and children. 11 mothers and about 20 children turned up and lots of fun was had, making masks and pasting hand shapes, as well as out door play. Lisa is happy to facilitate this again in the New Year.

Kerbside Waste and Recycling Contracts

Council's existing contracts for the collection of kerbside waste and recyclable materials including the disposal and sorting of these materials finished in June 2013.

Following the amalgamation of the Waste Management Groups and also the continuing discussion of Shared Services there were thoughts of initiating joint tenders in the region for Waste and Recycling Services.

Following further discussion it has been decided that due to Council's all being at different stages of their existing contracts that we would tender for our Waste & Recycling Services Contract.

I have commenced preparing the contract documentation for these contracts which will include the following:-

- Collection of Kerbside Waste
- Disposal of Waste to the Doon Regional Landfill
- Collection of Putrescibles Waste form Transfer Stations
- Collection of Roadside Waste from designated Rural Areas
- Collection of Kerbside Recycling Material
- Disposal of Sorting Recycling Material
- Collection of Rural Recycling material along designated routes
- Assistance with the collection and disposal of Waste and Recycling material from special events throughout the municipality
- Supply of waste and recyclables collection calendars and an amount for education purposes

The contract is for five years with an option for a further two years, Council existing contractor is Wimmera Mallee Waste from Rainbow.

Murtoa Swimming Pool Change rooms & Public Toilets

Council has been in discussions with Regional Development Victoria in relation to funding for the upgrade of the above mentioned facility.

Council together with representatives from the community, Regional Development Victoria and Rohan Fry from Grampians I-Design met onsite to ascertain what was required should this site be upgraded.

From this meeting it was agreed to engage a consulting engineer to establish the structural integrity of the existing building and what could be done with it.

Mr Bruce Hollioake the consulting engineer has undertaken a thorough inspection of the existing change rooms and toilets.

His conclusion is that the structural integrity of the building is not suitable to undertake an upgrade and the existing structure should be demolished.

Council's recommendation is to get the stakeholders together, develop a floor plan and then in discussion with the architects decide on suitable construction material and costs.

Once the plans and engineering costings are obtained, Council will then proceed with an application for funding.

Echelon ran three training sessions in the one day at the end of October focusing on Improving the Effectiveness of OHS Committees, Safety Leadership and OHS Contractor Management. The first training session focused around improving OHS Committees to be more effective, whereas the other two training sessions focused on the role and responsibility managers and staff has under the OHS Act when managing Council projects and contractors. Twenty eight staff attended the training sessions.

One hundred and twenty seven staff attended the Workplace Bullying and Harassment training at Warracknabeal as a result of the Workplace Bullying Survey conducted last year. Training was conducted over two and a half days and focused on workplace behaviours, types of bullying that can occur and the physical and sociological effects bullying has on staff. The Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission will conduct one more training session for those that were unable to attend the training.

The final draft of the Internal Risk Register Audit is currently being circulated amongst all managers to have a final check over before it is submitted to the Internal Audit Committee via AFS and Associates.

The HACCC OHS Safety Action Plan (SAP) is currently being developed for the Community Services Department. The SAP is a clear and logical (systematic) process of documenting OHS processes and assists in keeping track of everything that needs to be done.

Results of Echelons Targeted Risk Appraisal of the Warracknabeal Waste Transfer Station have been submitted to the Infrastructure Manager along with a risk assessment of the suspended foot bridge over Yarriambiack Creek. The risk management findings of the Waste Transfer Station will be used as a guide to allow Council to improve public safety at all of its waste station sites throughout the Shire. The footbridge Risk Management Audit has recommended minor improvements to minimise public risk at the site.

Country Football and Netball Program 2013/2014

The Hopetoun Community Centre and Football/Umpires Facilities Upgrade project has been approved with a grant of \$73,000 (please refer to the Putting Locals First Program section below for further details).

Putting Locals First Program

The Hopetoun Community Centre and Football/Umpires Facilities Upgrade have been approved with a grant of \$225,000. The total capital expenditure for this project is \$348,000.

Financial details of the overall project are: grants - \$298,000, cash from the Hopetoun Recreation Reserve Committee of Management - \$50,000 and in-kind labour and equipment to the value of \$58,300, which gives a total project cost of \$406,300.

The signed Activity Schedule has been received by Council.

The tender process has now been instigated.

Community Facility Funding Program 2014/2015 – Minor Facilities

Berry's Sports Surfaces have completed the installation of the Murtoa Bowling Club synthetic green and the Club is now arranging for Bowls Victoria approval.

Local Facilities for Local Clubs Program – 2014/2015

The application to construct a dual cricket practice wicket at the Minyip Recreation Reserve (for use by the Rupanyup Minyip Cricket Club), has been approved with a grant of \$22,000 for a total project cost of \$44,060.

The signed Activity Schedule has been received by Council and it is anticipated work will commence early in 2015.

Country Football and Netball Program 2014/2015

This is the final round of this program as it currently stands and I am working with the Minyip Murtoa Football & Netball Club and the Minyip Recreation Reserve Committee of Management to develop an application for submission under this round of the program to upgrade their sporting facilities at the Minyip Recreation Reserve. Works are to include re-sheeting of the netball court (to address Netball Victoria non-compliance issues), construction of netballer's showers and toilets and upgrading the football change rooms showers and toilets.

Grant applications for this final round close on 30 January 2015.

12 Month Outcomes Reports

The 12 Month Outcomes Reports have been completed, and submitted to Regional Development Victoria, for the Warracknabeal Streetscape Stage 3 and the Brim Sports and Social Club Air Conditioning Upgrade projects.

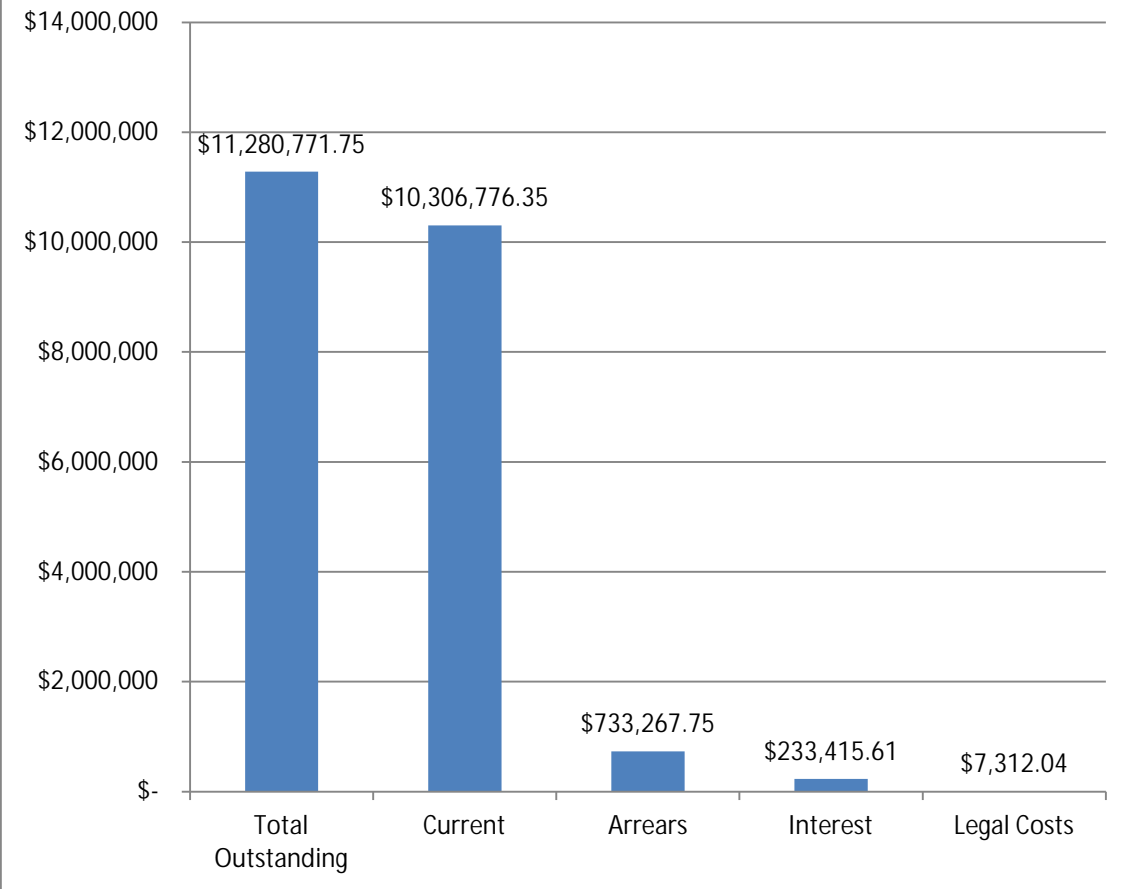
