BINDII IN TOWNS

An unfortunate effect of summer rain is the germination of Bindii, (*Tribulus terrestris*), also known as Caltrop, cat's head, goat's head, yellow vine, puncture vine and a few less polite names. Bindii loves bare ground and summer rains and will germinate and grow very quickly in the right conditions.

It is a flat, sprawling annual herb with attractive green leaves and yellow flowers. Its seed is the spiny burr that does the damage, and they will continue to form seeds if left alone. They can produce up to 1000 seeds on each plant.

They don't handle competition well, so the best prevention is a nice healthy lawn and nature strip.

The best time to control Bindii is before it sets seed, it can be pulled or treated with a variety of readily available garden chemicals, just

remember to be careful and follow the directions for use. They will continue to emerge after rain so you need to keep looking for them, don't think one treatment is enough. Bindii can emerge, flower and produce seed very quickly.

Once seed has set, it needs to be pulled up by the roots, put in a bag and binned for disposal, being careful to get all the seeds. The seeds are readily spread in car tyres, shoes, etc and are painful for feet and pets. Wear good gloves if pulling mature plants.

DOG & CAT REGISTRATIONS & PERMITS

Residents are reminded that with the upcoming Renewal of Anima Registrations in April; they must abide by the Limit to the Number of Animals to be kept in town. A detailed list of all animals can be found on our website at www.yarriambiack.vic.gov.au.

The maximum number of dogs to be kept in a town is 2 dogs, and for cats it is 3 cats. If you want to keep more than this you are required to apply for a Permit.

Permits are available at our Warracknabeal Office and at Gateway BEET in Hopetoun. The permits need to be approved by Council.

It is a requirement for all dogs and cats aged 3 months and over to be registered. Microchip registration is not the same as Pet registration. For those that continue to not register their dogs and cats; there are penalties that will apply.
